The committee finds it necessary to file a revision of its allocation report under the first concurrent budget resolution in view of the recognizes that the second budget resolution now under consideration by the Congress will likely modify the total amount of funding available for allocation by the committee and will require the filing of a represent a reordering of certain budgetary priorities. In particular, the committee notes that it would expect that the second resolution totals would not assume such elements as—the \$0.4 billion reduction in fiscal 1980 general revenue sharing payments which was incorporated in the first resolution totals. The committee also anticipates that the second resolution will allow for funding or payments to low-income families for needs related to increased energy costs. A program of this type is included in the crude oil tax bill which has been ordered reported by the committee. The same bill, as ordered reported, also provides for the establishment of a Taxpayer Trust Fund, in which certain revenues will be set aside to assure adequate resources for possible action next year relating to the scheduled 1981 social security tax increases. The committee will consider the budgetary requirements for these items when it files its allocation report under the second concurrent budget resolution for fiscal year 1980.
