1	OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. RON WYDEN, A U.S. SENATOR FROM
2	OREGON, CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE ON FINANCE
3	
4	The Chairman. The Committee will come to order. We
5	meet today to consider four pending nominations, Mr.
6	James Ives, Ms. Rose Jenkins, Mr. Adam Landy and Mr.
7	Kashi Way. We'll use the time now to make statements on
8	the nominees. I'm going to make a short statement,
9	followed by Senator Crapo, our Ranking Member, and then
10	followed by any other Finance member who wishes to make
11	a statement.
12	At that point if we have a quorum we'll proceed to
13	the vote. If we don't have a quorum, which I believe
14	will be the case. We'll recess until the next roll call
15	vote on the Senate floor expected to be at 11:30. The
16	Committee will reconvene on the floor to have the vote.
17	Is that acceptable to you, Senator Crapo?
18	Senator Crapo. Yes.
19	The Chairman. With respect to my opening statement,
20	we're going to vote on the four nominations, James Ives,
21	nominated to serve as Inspector General of the
22	Department of Treasury. Ms. Rose Jenkins, Adam Landy
23	and Kashi Way, are all nominated to serve as Judges in
24	the United States Tax Court. I'll have brief remarks on
25	these nominees, and Senator Crapo will be free to make

- 1 his remarks.
- 2 To kick off the nominees, with respect to Treasury
- 3 Inspector General, this is the watchdog at the Treasury
- 4 Department, key to rooting out fraud, waste and abuse.
- 5 The Inspector General oversees a multi-billion dollar
- 6 budget, and some of the most powerful economic levers
- 7 there are. Treasury has not confirmed an Inspector
- 8 General for five years. It's important that the
- 9 person's role is undaunted by political pressure, and
- 10 willing to tackle big challenges.
- James Ives is a strong nominee. He brings a wealth
- of oversight and law enforcement experience to the
- table, and from all corners of government. His three
- 14 decade career spans working in defense criminal
- 15 investigative service, the IG offices at Nassau, and the
- Government Publishing Office, the State Department,
- Diplomatic Service, and U.S. Coast Guard Investigative
- 18 Service.
- 19 His broadest things will serve him well as Treasury
- 20 Inspector General. With respect to the three Court
- 21 nominations, this Court is the Judicial backbone in the
- 22 Federal Tax Code. Americans rely on the Court to
- 23 dispute tax bills before they need to pay them. It's
- 24 the key to making sure taxpayers are heard in a timely
- 25 manner.

The three nominees have experience in both the
public and private sector. That experience will be
invaluable. Rose Jenkins has 15 years of experience in
the Tax Court. She's now an attorney in the IRS Office
of Associate Chief Counsel for Procedure and
Administration.
Adam Landy has served as a Special Trial Judge on
the Tax Courts since 2021. He has several years of
experience at the Office of the IRS Chief's Counsel in
Baltimore and elsewhere.
Kashi Way is a Senior Legislative Counsel with the
Joint Committee on Taxation. He's been there 18 years,
and had a major impact on about every piece of energy
legislation that has moved in the Congress, and other
legislation. This Committee will be sorry to lose Mr.
Way on the Joint Committee, but that is the gain of the
Tax Court, and the American people.
All four of these nominees are very qualified for
the roles that they're nominated to fill. I support
each of them, I urge my colleagues to do the same, and

4	Senator Crapo. Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman,
5	and I will briefly comment on each of the nominees as
6	well. Mr. Ives has significant experience in the
7	Inspector General community, and I appreciate his many
8	years of public service, and willingness to serve as the
9	Inspector General of the Treasury Department if
10	confirmed.
11	I was encouraged by his commitment to keep Congress
12	fully informed in the oversight of the Treasury
13	Department, and to provide prompt and thorough responses
14	to the Finance Committee. It is critical to have an
15	effective Inspector General to monitor how the taxpayer
16	dollars are spent, and to ensure a professional level of
17	work at the IG's office.
18	I look forward to Mr. Ives partnering with Congress
19	to hold objective oversight of the Treasury Department.
20	Moving to the other three nominees under consideration
21	today, Ms. Jenkins, Mr. Landy and Mr. Way, who have been
22	nominated to serve as Judges of the U.S. Tax Court.
23	Each of these nominees are without question, highly
24	qualified tax experts, and they have each committed to
25	being fair and impartial to all individuals before the

- 1 Court. 2 Mr. Way has served on the staff of the Joint 3 Committee, as the Chairman has indicated for taxation 4 for nearly 20 years, providing important advice to the 5 members during this enactment of key tax legislation. I 6 appreciate Mr. Way's work with this Committee over the 7 years. 8 If confirmed, I fully expect each of the nominees to 9 treat taxpayers with the respect and dignity and 10 fairness they deserve, and for these reasons, I will be 11 voting yes on each of these nominees, and I encourage my 12 colleagues to do the same. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 13 The Chairman. Thank you very much, Senator Crapo. 14 It's evident that there is not a quorum present, so at 15 this point, unless there's an objection, the Committee will recess and reconvene to vote on the nominations 16 17 following the first vote that will occur at 11:30 off 18 the Senate floor in Room 219. Without objection, it's so ordered the Committee 19
- 20 stands in recess.
