Mr. SMOOT, from the Committee on Finance, submitted the following

REPORT.

[To accompany S. J. Res. 207.]

The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred Senate joint resolution 207, admitting into the United States 35 puncheons of Gordon's sloe gin, ordered by E. La Montagne's Sons, of New York, before the passage of the food-control act prohibiting the importation of distilled spirits, the delivery of which was delayed on account of war conditions until after that act went into effect, having had the same under consideration, report it back to the Senate without amendment and recommend that the resolution do pass.
