The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred Senate joint resolution 217, admitting into the United States 560 barrels of Spanish wine ordered by Luigi Bick, of New York City, before the passage of the food-control act prohibiting the importation of distilled spirits, the delivery of which was delayed on account of war conditions until after that act went into effect, having had the same under consideration, report it back without amendment and recommend that the resolution do pass.
