REPORT

[To accompany S. Res. 334]

The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the resolution (S. Res. 334) directing the United States Tariff Commission to conduct an investigation, particularly by resort to available files and records and to report thereon to the Senate assembled data, furnishing the Senate completed portions thereof as promptly as conditions permit, having considered the same report it back to the Senate without amendment and recommend that the resolution do pass.
