CONFERENCE REPORT

[To accompany H.R. 9145]

The committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendments of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 9145) to authorize the attendance of the Marine Band at the National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic to be held at Rochester, N. Y., August 14, 15, and 16, 1934, having met, after full and free conference have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 3 and agree to the same.

Amendment numbered 1:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 1, and agree to the same with an amendment, as follows:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by said amendment insert the following: *, and the National Convention of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War to be held at Colorado Springs, Colorado, during the first week in July 1934;* and the Senate agree to the same.

Amendment numbered 2:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 2, and agree to the same with an amendment, as follows:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by said amendment insert the following: *encampment and convention;* and the Senate agree to the same.

Amendment of title:

That the House recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the Senate to the title of said bill, and agree to the same with an amendment, as follows:

In lieu of the amendment to the title of the bill proposed by the Senate insert the following:

An Act to authorize the attendance of the Marine Band at the National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic to be held at Rochester, New York, August 14, 15, and 16, 1934, and at the National Convention of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War, to be held at Colorado Springs, Colorado, during the first week in July 1934.

And the Senate agree to the same.

STATEMENT OF THE MANAGERS ON THE PART OF THE HOUSE

The managers on the part of the House at the conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendments of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 9145) to authorize the attendance of the Marine Band at the National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic to be held at Rochester, N.Y., August 14, 15, and 16, 1934, submit the following statement in explanation of the effect of the action agreed upon and recommended in the accompanying conference report as to each of such amendments, namely:

Amendment no. 1: Limits the conventions and encampments at which the Marine Band may attend to those of the Disabled American Veterans of the World War and the Grand Army of the Republic, instead of including also the convention of the Thirtieth Division of the American Expeditionary Forces, as proposed by the Senate, and confining attendance to the encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic only, as was proposed by the House.

Amendment no. 2: Provides for attendance of the Marine Band at one encampment and one convention in order to conform with the provisions agreed to in amendment no. 1.

Amendment no. 3: Authorizes an appropriation of \$11,000 for expenses, instead of \$3,700, as proposed by the House.

The title of this bill is amended to conform with the purpose of the measure as agreed to by the conferees.
