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BAUCUS ANNOUNCES DAVID SCHWARTZ TO SERVE AS FINANCE COMMITTEE ACTING HEALTH POLICY CHIEF

Schwartz currently serves as Health Counsel to the Chairman for Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), pharmacy and pharmaceutical issues, medical malpractice, and program integrity in federal health care programs. He began working on the Committee as a Capitol Hill Fellow in 2004 and as a detailee from the Social Security Administration in 2005 and 2006 before joining the permanent staff in 2007. Schwartz has also previously served as an Attorney-Advisor in the Medicare division of the Social Security Administration's Office of Hearings and Appeals.
