Re: Baucus Applauds the Start of U.S.-EU Trade Talks

Senate Finance Committee Chairman Max Baucus (D-Mont.) today applauded the announcement that free trade agreement negotiations between the United States and the European Union will begin next month. Chairman Baucus pushed for the talks to address <u>the EU's longstanding barriers to U.S.</u> <u>products</u>, including agricultural goods. From Chairman Baucus:
