We are writing to express our strong support for S. 3335, the *Jobs, Energy, Families and Disaster Relief Act of 2008.* We are specifically interested in a provision in the bill which would extend and modify the domestic film production incentive which is designed to preserve U.S. film and television production jobs.

Section 181 was enacted in 2004 to help combat the efforts by other countries to create jobs by attracting U.S. film production. The section 181 incentive, when combined with state incentive programs, is an effective means of preserving highly skilled, well-paid jobs across the United States in the U.S. film and television industry.
