STATEMENT OF THE MANAGERS ON THE PART OF THE HOUSE

The managers on the part of the House at the conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendment of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 2906) to extend the period for filing claims for credit or refund of overpayments of income taxes arising as a result of renegotiation of Government contracts, submit the following statement in explanation of the effect of the action agreed upon by the conferees and recommended in the accompanying conference report:

The Senate amendment added to the bill as passed the House a new section 2, directing the Secretary of the Treasury or his delegate to allow credit or refund to Dexter Phillips and Jeanette H. Phillips of an income tax overpayment for the calendar year 1951, to the extent such overpayment was attributable to the erroneous inclusion in their gross income for such year of the amount received by Dexter Phillips in final distribution of his grandfather's estate. The House recedes.
