1	OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. RON WYDEN, A U.S. SENATOR FROM
2	OREGON, CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE ON FINANCE
3	
4	The Chairman. The Finance Committee will come to
5	order. We meet today to consider a pending nomination
6	for the Committee, Mr. David Johnson. We're going to
7	use the statement now to make statements on the nominee.
8	I'm going to make a statement, followed by my
9	colleague from Idaho, then followed by any other Finance
10	member who wishes to make a statement. At that point,
11	if we have a quorum, which I do not believe we will
12	have, we would proceed to the vote.
13	If we don't have a quorum, we'll recess until the
14	next roll call vote on the Senate floor, when the
15	Committee will reconvene off the floor to have the vote.
16	Senator Crapo and I have talked about this, and this is
17	an acceptable process for both sides.
18	So, my very brief statement before I yield to my
19	colleague, I would say first, a quick set of comments
20	with respect to Mr. Johnson's background. This is a
21	non-partisan down the middle nominee for a position that
22	requires exactly that type of individual.
23	Mr. Johnson currently serves as the Assistant
24	Inspector General for Investigations at the Department
25	of Veterans Affairs, which is a key oversight role at

1 the second largest federal agency. He previously served

- 2 as a federal prosecutor in a few different positions.
- 3 That includes several years as Assistant Chief in the
- 4 Fraud Section of the Criminal Division of the Department
- 5 of Justice.
- 6 He also served as Assistant United States Attorney
- 7 and Health Care Fraud Coordinator at the U.S. Attorney's
- 8 Office for the District of Columbia.
- 9 Independent oversight of the IRS, in my view, is
- in the best interest of all our taxpayers. This is a
- 11 challenging job by any measure. The Treasury Department
- has a separate inspector general. The tax issues and
- 13 the IRS require their own special focus.
- 14 TIGTA, as it's known in the tax policy vernacular,
- is all about good government and protecting taxpayer
- dollars at the IRS. It helps improve tax administration
- and fights waste, fraud and abuse. Those are priorities
- 18 for members on both sides of the dais here.
- 19 The Committee depends on TIGTA to provide the
- 20 public with unbiased information and nonpartisan
- oversight, to help us do our jobs. It is my view that
- 22 Mr. Johnson is highly qualified, and I thought we had a
- very helpful hearing a few weeks ago.
- I want it understood that I strongly support his
- 25 nomination. I would urge all my colleagues to do the

- 1 same.
- 2 Let me turn it over now to Senator Crapo. If
- 3 other colleagues wish to make opening remarks, they can.
- 4 Otherwise, we'll adjourn until our vote off the floor.

1	OPENING STATEMENT OF HON. MIKE CRAPO, A U.S. SENATOR
2	FROM IDAHO

4	Senator Crapo. Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman.
5	Mr. Johnson has been nominated to serve as Inspector
6	General for Tax Administration at the Department of
7	Treasury. I agree with the Chairman. Mr. Johnson has
8	strong qualifications and oversight experience, and I
9	appreciate his service at the Department of Veterans
10	Affairs and his willingness to serve today.
11	I was encouraged to hear Mr. Johnson's commitment
12	to distinguishing allegations of waste, fraud, and abuse
13	from disagreements in policy, ensuring that TIGTA holds
14	accountable any individual who unlawfully discloses
15	taxpayer information, and providing the Senate Finance
16	Committee with timely and thorough updates of
17	investigations permitted by law.
18	I was also encouraged to hear that Mr. Johnson and
19	I share common ground on the need for the IRS to keep
20	taxpayer information confidential, and for personal
21	information to not be used against taxpayers to advance
22	political agendas.
23	However, that being said, given that the new
24	Congress will be sworn in only less than month from
25	today, and the new administration will take office just

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        shortly thereafter, it's my opinion that these newly
 2
        elected officials deserve the opportunity themselves to
 3
        evaluate this appointment. Therefore today, I will not
 4
        be able to support Mr. Johnson's nomination.
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              That said, I look forward to working with Mr.
 6
        Johnson, if he is confirmed, in addressing the concerns
 7
        that my colleagues and I have raised throughout this
 8
        process, and ensuring that TIGTA continues to provide
 9
        essential oversight of the IRS and our nation's system.
