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The Chairman. The hearing will come to order.

We have this morning, of course, the Rules Committee requiring each Committee to report an annual funding resolution by January 1 of each calendar year, and that resolution carries us through a budget year beginning on March 1, 1988 and ending on February 28, 1989.

They have set a guideline for each Committee to follow in reporting its annual funding resolution. The guideline is that the 1988-1989 budget should be equal to last year's except for the 2 percent cost of living adjustment to staff salaries.

Now each of the members has received a markup material bulletin which includes a proposed resolution and that resolution meets the Rules Committee guidelines. It simply takes last year's budget and increases it by \$45,660.00 to cover the 2 percent cost of living increase. You may recall that last year we had a supplemental appropriation as well as an annual resolutiong and this is included in this.

We expect another busy year for this Committee. We have major conferences to conclude on Trade and Catastrophic Health Insurance. We have the issue of Work and Welfare to address. We have the U.S./Canadian trade agreement. We have the Technical Corrections bill on taxes, and we will be exploring other areas as far as the health and welfare of our children. I think we have a very lean appropiration for the

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work of this Committee.

Now you have all received a ranking of the size of appropriations of the other Committees. We can justify a substantially large budget based on the comparisons in that chart. However, I am asking the Committee to approve a continuation budget set forth in the proposed legislation so that we comply with what the Rules Committee has requested of us.

The Rules Committee has also thought about working out a comprehensive review of the workloads of the various

Committees to see if there shouldn't be a further adjustment in the amount of appropriations for each one of them. Senator Packwood and I will be participating in that and certainly urging a more equitable balance of the funds to each Committee.

Senator Packwood. That is a risk I would be willing to run, Mr. Chairman, rather than just going on the basis of last year. And I think we would come out all right.

The Chairman. Oh, I know we would. And I appreciate the fact that the Committee members have been able to come by and register their support in their proxies in support of this measure.

Senator Packwood. Mr. Chairman, I move to report the budget as presented to the Committee.

The Chairman. All in favor make it known by saying aye.

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(Chorus of "ayes".) The Chairman. Thank you very much. (Whereupon, at 10:32 a.m., the meeting was concluded.
