19 The Clerk. Mr. Bradley?

21 The Chairman. Go ahead, Susan.

22 The Clerk. Mr. Mitchell?

23 Senator Long. Aye.

24 The Clerk. Mr. Pryor?

25 Senator Long. Aye.

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The Clerk. Mr. Chairman?

The Chairman. Aye.

Senator Long. I would just ask that Senator Bradley be permitted to record himself. I don't have his proxy.

The Chairman. We will leave the record open because if Mr. Bradley votes "aye," that would be unanimous and we will check with Mr. Bradley's office.

Now if you want to call the roll on Mr. Pearlman. And, again, I have the proxies for all the Republicans.

Senator Long. It's the same on this side, Mr. Chairman.

The Chairman. Mr. Pearlman, congratulations.

Mr. Pearlman. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.
