## REPORT

The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the bill (H. R. 10155), to permit articles imported from foreign countries for the purpose of exhibition at the Seventh World's Poultry Congress and Exposition, Cleveland, Ohio, 1939, to be admitted without payment of tariff, and for other purposes, having considered the same, report favorably thereon without amendment and recommend that the bill be passed.

The bill conforms to the usual form of bills and resolutions heretofore passed by Congress permitting the free entry of articles for exhibition purposes and is in the form heretofore approved by the Treasury
