Amendment #26, Grassley/Thune #3, as Modified: Notification of unauthorized inspection of disclosure of returns and return information;

Amendment #77, Brown/Cardin/Stabenow/Bennet/Schumer/Menendez #1: Raising the cap for IRS VITA matching grant program allocation to \$30 million, subject to appropriation override; and

Amendment #56, Coats #2: Protection of victims of employment –related identity theft – approved by voice vote en bloc.
