The Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the bill (S. 5987) to amend subsection 11 of section 3244, Revised Statutes, having considered the same, report thereon with a recommendation that it do pass.

Sir: I have the honer to acknowledge receipt of letter, dated 25th instant, from the clerk to your committee, referring Senate bill 5987, entitled "A bill to amend subsection 11 of section 3244, Revised Statutes," to this department with request that your committee be furnished with such suggestions as may be deemed proper touching the merits of the bill and the propriety of its passage.

In reply you are advised that Senate bill 5987 meets with the approval of this department, which has held that salesmen of manufacturers and jobbers are, under the present wording of the statute, to be regarded as peddlers of tobacco when they sell and deliver manufacturers to be retail dealers which they obtain from jobbers or direct from the manufacturers. The statutes relating to peddlers of tobacco are regulatory and not revenue producing, and it is thought that the amendment sugregulatory and not revenue producing, and it is thought that the amendment suggested will tend to increase the sale of manufactured tobacco and consequently increase the revenues from this source, and that no loss or fraud upon the revenue can accrue therefrom.
