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1 SEC. 4. BUDGETARY PROVISIONS.

(a) STATUTORY PAYGO.—The budgetary effects of 2 3 this Act, for the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pav-As-You-Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by ref-4 5 erence to the latest statement titled 'Budgetary Effects of PAYGO Legislation' for this Act, jointly submitted for 6 7 printing in the Congressional Record by the Chairmen of 8 the House and Senate Budget Committees, provided that 9 such statement has been submitted prior to the vote on passage in the House acting first on this conference report 10 11 or amendment between the Houses.

12 (b) EMERGENCY DESIGNATIONS.—Sections 2 and 13 3—

(1) are designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 4(g) of the Statutory PayAs-You-Go Act of 2010 (Public Law 111–139; 2
U.S.C. 933(g));

(2) in the House of Representatives, are designated as an emergency for purposes of pay-as-yougo principles; and

(3) in the Senate, are designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 403(a) of S.
Con. Res. 13 (111th Congress), the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2010.
